Payment methods

- EFTPOS – By phone 03 9877 1177 or in person at the general office
- Cash – In person at the general office
- BPAY – please refer to letter containing your families unique BPAY reference or contact the office

To access the Compass Portal

- Enter the following URL into the address line in your web browser. NB: Compass works best with Google Chrome. You can also access Compass via the Box Hill High School website homepage.

- Login to the Compass Portal using your **unique Parent Compass ID and your Password.**
- In the Compass Portal, click on the Organisation Tab/Student Management/**Course Confirmation Payments**. Click on the hyperlinked line to process your payment.
- Follow the Compass instructions and input your credit card details.
You can choose to either **“Pay in full”** or **“Pay by Instalments”**. **(2 Options available)**
- If you choose to **pay by instalments**, then the instalments will be automatically processed on the following dates.

Option 1

- Instalment 1 26th January 2024
- Instalment 2 29th March 2024
- Instalment 3 31st May 2024

Option 2

- Instalment 1 23rd February 2024
- Instalment 2 31st May 2024

If you choose to **pay in full**, then the full amount will be deducted on the **same day** that you process your payment on Compass. If you need to change your Credit Card details on an instalment payment plan set up via Compass, you will need to contact the General Office to make these changes for you.

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Refunds

Parent requests for a refund in the event of an extra-curricular activity being cancelled are subject to the discretion of the school and made on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be considered under the following conditions:

- Cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances
- In the event of serious illness or accident

Refunds will be provided where the school deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, **taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred by the school**, the Department's Parent Payment Policy and Guidance, Financial Help for Families Policy and any other relevant information. Please note that voluntary donations are non-refundable.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
